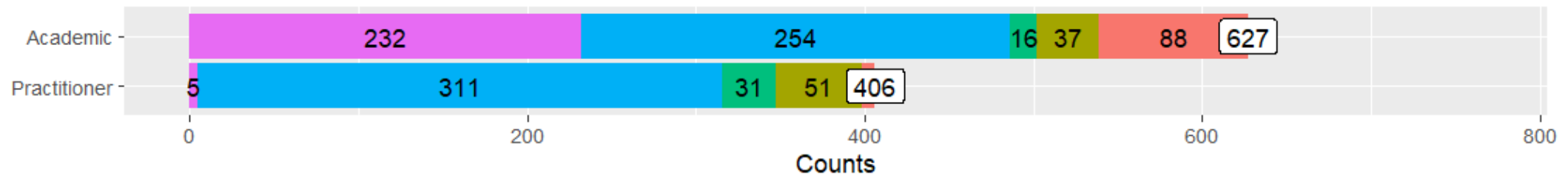
June 2025 - Total 918 members

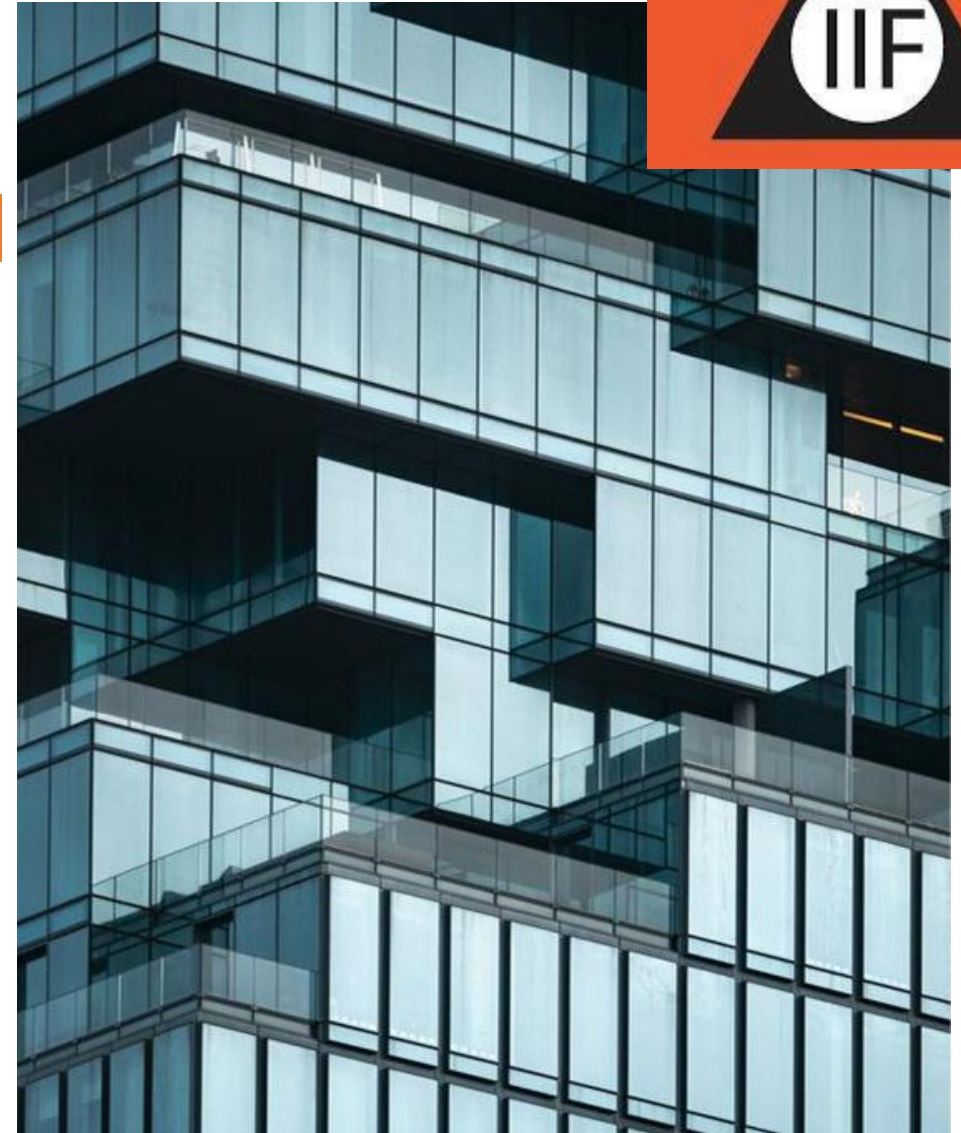

# Our goals

# 2024 Year-End Cash Balance



# 2024 was a year of relative stability



- We get a much lower operating loss to support key programs of \$29 690 (vs \$161k in 2023) in particular thanks to the ISF24 in Dijon that generated a net income of +\$75 169
- We remain in a **strong financial position** with a cash balance of \$402k (\$459k at June 4, 2025)
- **Many thanks** to all our **members** supporting the IIF. Also, big thanks to all those who helped solicit sponsors, and thanks to those **sponsors** for supporting the IIF.





# 2024 Profit and Loss

Let's dive in

## 2024 was a year of relative stability



Cash Accounting	January - December 2024
Revenue	512 583
Expenses	542 274
Net Income	-29 691

- **Operating loss:** \$29 691 (5,7% of revenue, compared to 38.2% in 2023).
- **Expenses:** \$542 274 (vs \$580 383 in 2023, 6.5% reduction, largest single-year expenditure in the history of IIF because of **workshops + FSS + awards + travel grants** (+~\$82K) and **Foresight** (+~\$17K))
- **Revenues:** \$513 583 (vs \$419 700 in 2023, 22.2% increase)

## A look into the future



- While the IIF's financial position continues to be **extremely strong**, the Board will still need to ensure that it **remains stable** in the future in spite of uncertainties related to future funding
- Some measures have been carried out / discussed:
  - Limitations in some expenses
  - Projects to increase income => Foresight Practitioner Conference
  - ISF25 is likely to generate a profit
  - **Monitoring:** Treasurer will review the books every three months.

# IIF SAS Award



- For the past 19 years, the IIF, in collaboration with SAS®, has provided financial support for research on how to improve forecasting methods and business forecasting practice
- Two \$10,000 grants are awarded each year: one in methodology and one in applications

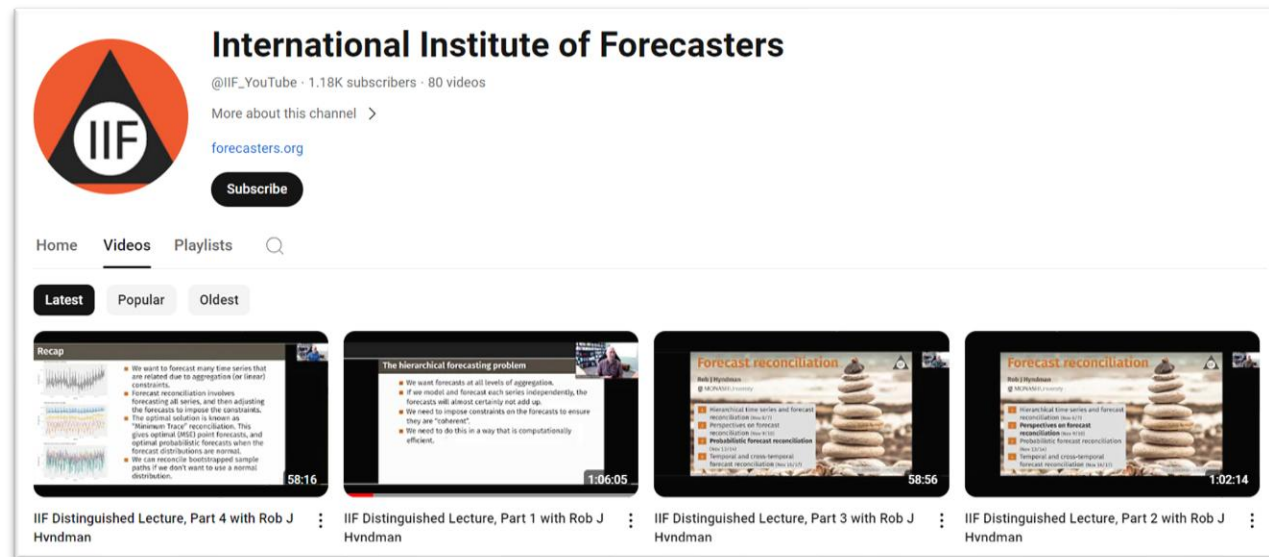

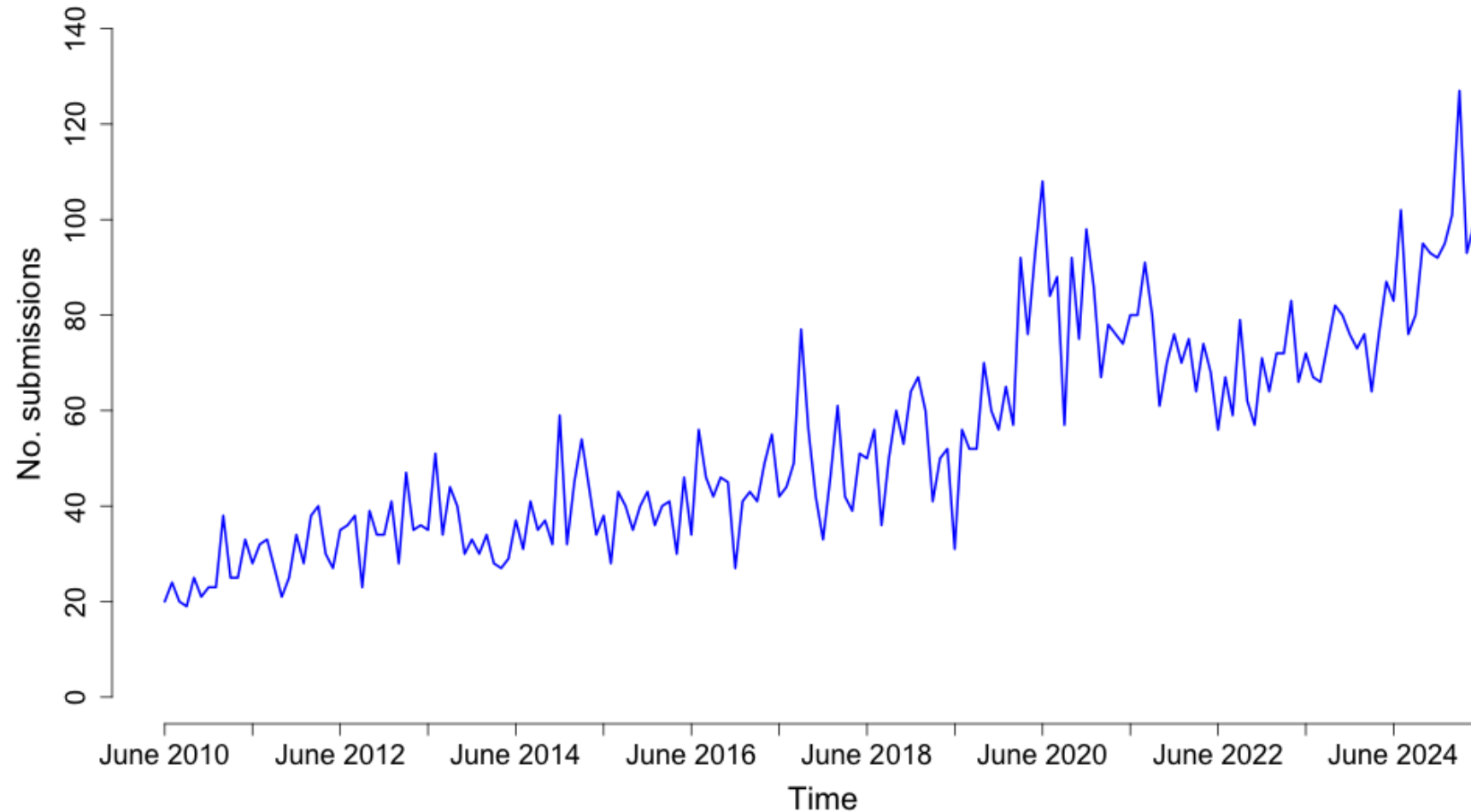

For the period from June 2024 to May 2025:

- Number of submissions: 1136
- Acceptance rate: 10.7% (increased slightly after the last year's 9%)
- Desk rejection rate and out of scope: >50%

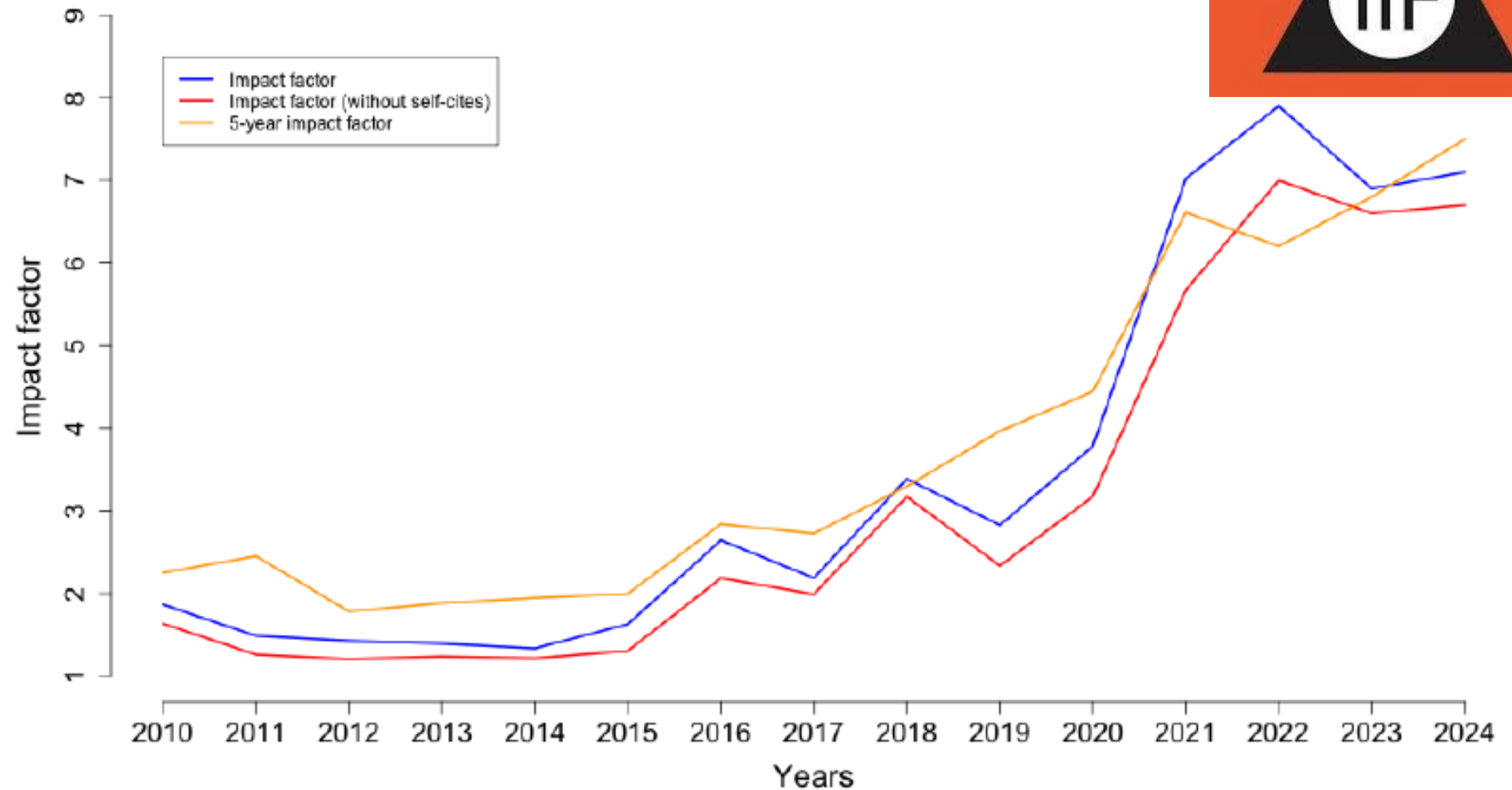


The journal impact statistics from Clarivate/ISI were released on 18 June 2025 (for 2024).



## Impact Factor values for 2024:

- 2-year IF:  
**7.1**  
*(up from 6.9)*
- 2-year IF  
(without self-cites):  
**6.7**
- 5-year IF:  
**7.5**



Eventually, IJF is then ranked Q1 in Economics (rank: 17/617) and Q1 in Management (rank: 50/420)

## Reproducibility and open science

From now on:

- data and code **must** be shared (unless exemption is requested to EiC)
- numerical results **must** be replicated



### Data and code availability

New section at the end of manuscripts, disclosing availability conditions, providing links, acknowledging sources and curation, etc.

### Reproducibility checks

Performed/coordinated by a replicability editor, with the (external) support of CASCaD
