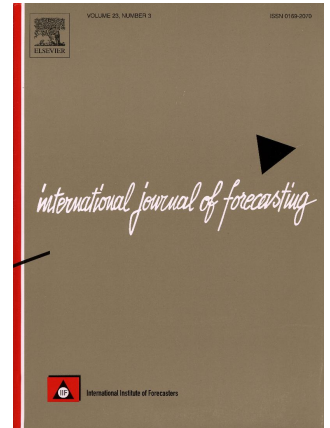
International Journal of Forecasting - IJF Archivist

It functions as a Retrieval-Augmented Generation (RAG) system to retrieve contents from the journal's corpus and uses an LLM interface to summarize the queried documents in a comprehensive, structural and interactive manner. About the IIF Award: The IIF Award for the Impact of Forecasting in Practice aims to recognize and showcase businesses or institutions that achieve significant impact by applying forecasting, while contributing to the forecasting community. Applications are evaluated in 5 key areas: Impact to the business or institution, Impact on the forecasting community, Challenge, Role of forecasting in the solution, and Style/quality of the submission and presentation. The award comes with a \$10,000 cash prize to the first-place winning team. A non-cash recognition may be issued to the second-place runner-up, at the award committee's discretion.



Member Profile - Jue Wang

Jue Wang is a Professor at the Center for Forecasting Science, Academy of Mathematics and Systems Science, Chinese Academy of Sciences. She currently serves as Deputy Director of the Center for Forecasting Science, Vice Dean of the School of Continuing Education at the University of Chinese Academy of Sciences, and is a Standing Director of the Systems Engineering Society of China as well as the Chair of the Decision Science Society under the Operations Research Society of China. Her research is published in academic journals such as International Journal of Forecasting, IEEE Transactions on Fuzzy Systems, and European Journal of Operational Research. She co-edited a special issue on 'Food and Agriculture Forecasting' for International Journal of Forecasting in 2021. Additionally, she leads several research grants and consultation projects in energy forecasting and economic forecasting, funded by the National Natural Science Foundation of China. Jue is the Program Chair for [ISF2025](#).

We are proud to announce the PhD Forecasting Hackathon, hosted by the Tourism and Hospitality section of the International Institute of Forecasters at the prestigious International Symposium on Forecasting at 10am-5pm on June 29, 2025. This hackathon will challenge you to unleash your forecasting skills and predict the future of the tourism demand in Hong Kong and Macau.



The task is to forecast the monthly visitor arrivals from the top 5 source markets for Hong Kong and Macau, spanning from May 2024 to April 2025.

The historical data of visitor arrivals of top 10 source markets will be provided and participants are allowed to use any publicly available data sources in addition to the provided dataset. Participants can compete individually or in teams of up to 4 members. The top-performing individuals or teams will receive a cash prize up to USD 250 and a bottle of wine from Ningxia, China.
