Member Profile - Feng Li

Dr. Feng Li born in Erdos, Inner Mongolia, China, joined the Guanghua School of Management at Peking University in 2024 as an Associate Professor in the Department of Business Statistics and Econometrics. Prior to this, he served as an Assistant Professor and later as an Associate Professor of Statistics at the Central University of Finance and Economics in Beijing, China, where he also held the position of Associate Dean for the School of Statistics and Mathematics from 2016 to 2023. He earned his Ph.D. in Statistics from Stockholm University, Sweden, in 2013. Feng Li will be serving as the Local Chair for ISF 2025.

Dr. Li has led and contributed to impactful research projects and grants. He is currently funded by the National Natural Science Foundation of China (NSFC, 2025+) for research on video time series forecasting. His prior projects include a study on hierarchical economic forecasting from a global modeling perspective, supported by the National Social Science Fund of China (2022–2024). He has also received industry recognition and

funding, notably from Alibaba Inc. (2021–2023) for complex time series forecasting in e-commerce and the Hong Kong Jockey Club (2024+). Additionally, his work has extended to the clinical evaluation of Traditional Chinese Medicine and the projection of myopia trends under an NSFC grant (2020–2024). Earlier, Dr. Li spearheaded the development of efficient Bayesian flexible density methods for high-dimensional financial data, supported by NSFC (2016–2020) and the Ministry of Education of China (2014–2016). These projects underscore his commitment to advancing statistical

methodologies, scalable algorithms, and practical applications across diverse domains.
